



Please help us raise £8,000/ \$9,000 / €9,000 / CAD 13,000 by Christmas so the school can buy the basic equipment & resources it needs.

At Mukwashi Trust School, we teach our learners to be creative and resourceful — to make the most they can from the little they have.

Our staff lead by example: they work long hours, teach large, mixed-age classes with no IT and very few resources, make new classroom displays for each half-term's topics — and produce exceptional national examination results. It's no wonder the school has grown so much in the last three years.





In the last twelve months, staff have helped learners construct a large goat house from waste they found on site, build a small store from the leftovers of our demolished latrines, and convert old bus wheels into cooking braziers for the school kitchen.

Every child in our upper primary learns to 'design & sew' — and they all make a rug for their homes. And every child in our secondary conducts agricultural experiments on their own plot of land — and takes whatever they harvest home to their families.

Our staff and learners do all this with next-to-no tools: please help us provide them with the equipment and resources they need to achieve even more.




(\$3,000, €3,000, CAD 4,000)

Our two science teachers need 45 metal lab stools, 30 scientific posters and 160 pieces of scientific equipment for the learners (stop watches, droppers, electronic scales, measuring cylinders, conical flasks, bunsen burners, smoke boxes, evaporating dishes, pipettes, defragging spoons, glass rods, tongs, wash bottles, delivery tubes, bell jars, gas syringes, overflow cans & thermocouples).

Each stool will cost about £30 / \$40 / \$40 / CAD 55, and each poster and piece of equipment will cost an average of £5 / \$6 /CAD 9.










For agricultural learning resources (\$2,500, €2,500, CAD 3,500)

Our two agriculture staff need 100 basic garden tools for their learners (trowels, forks, spades, rakes, hoes, watering cans, secateurs, axes, augers, machetes, pruning saws, etc), 50 hens (plus feeders & drinkers), four goats (and a drenching gun, elastrator, ear tag applicator, syringe, sprayer & castrator) and a final 45 fruit trees (guava, mango, orange, pomegranate, tangelo, pawpaw, grape, granadilla & nectarine).

Each tool & hen will cost about £6 / \$7 / \in 7 / CAD 10; each goat £100 / \$120 / \in 120 / CAD / 170; and each tree £20 / \$25 / \in 25 / CAD 40.



(\$2,000, €2,000, CAD 2,500)


Our two maintenance staff desperately need twenty proper tools (an angle grinder; tenon, hack, cross-cut & bow saws; 5m tape; plane; surform; claw, pin & club hammers; three wheelbarrows; welding shield; snip sheet; glasscutter; and sets of spanners, g-clamps & screwdrivers). The office needs a 5G router, our bore-hole pump needs some custom-made security, and the school itself could do with four enormous, double sided, external signs.

The tools only cost an average of £5 / \$6 / CAD 8 each, but the signs and security will all cost about £250 / \$300 / \$300 / CAD 400 for each one.
